From Romans 12: 10-13



church, these are words of encouragement that are instilled in me, and I hope all of you, that we are devoted to one another and those that we serve in His name.



This is a true story written by Christy Jordan-Fenton and her mother-in-law, Margaret Pokiak-Fenton. Margaret was only eight years old in 1944 when she travelled to Aklavik, NWT, from Banks Island, just north of Victoria Island, to attend a Catholic residential school. Children's clothing was taken away and

hair cut short. They were not allowed

to speak their native language. Children were stripped of their culture and skills. They were abused and endured unpleasant chores and unfair punishment. Margaret was willing to endure almost anything to learn to read! The book is intended for Grades 4-6 but adults would find it moving and educational.

n Sunday, July 23rd approximately a dozen members of Calvary United participated in London's Annual Pride Parade. From the staging area on Quebec St. the parade followed Queens Ave. to Victoria Park, where celebrations continued for many.

Siloam United provided a large trailer for those who wished to ride. The truck was festooned with the names of the 13 participating United Churches of London. Others walked behind carrying banners from participating churches, including Calvary's for the 2.5 kilometre parade. London United Churches were part of almost 130 different groups supporting the Pride movement.

Rev. Charmaine and the musicians of Trinity and Mt. Zion churches provided soulful entertainment at the front of the UCC contingent. The weather behaved, and the crowd lining the route was exuberant. The support of the London police along the route kept everyone in a good mood.

his year there were no applications for the Calvary Scholarship Program. A total of 18 scholarships have been awarded over the last 19 years for a total amount of \$8,400. Scholarships under this program are currently \$750 each. Up until 2013, the Scholarship Program was funded by donations from the congregation. In 2013, the Trustees agreed to fund \$3,500 for future scholarships.

This year, bursaries totaling \$4,000 were awarded to two students under the Calvary Bursary Program. Because bursaries are based on financial need, we do not publish the names of the recipients or the individual amounts of the bursaries. In the last 19 years a total of \$63,000 has been awarded under the Bursary Program. The Bursary Program was permanently funded several years ago by the estate of Miriam Lois Gibson.

The Calvary Scholarship Program and the Calvary Bursary Program are administered by the Board of Trustees. Each year the Board appoints a Selection Committee to review applications and award scholarships and bursaries. Details of the two programs are available on the church website. (www.calvaryuc.ca)
